

## 'HE GAVE US EYES TO SEE THEM' - RAILINGS AND KNEELERS


This month we visit St Nicholas' Church, Compton in Surrey. It is a very fine building with an unusual double sanctuary on two floors at the east end. Our eyes look up to see a gallery and an altar, and then at ground level is another altar surrounded by a glorious Norman arch with Jacobean railings and kneelers. As we enter this church, we realise with T S Eliot in 'Little Gidding' that we are here 'to kneel where prayer has been valid.'




With the liturgical reform of the last century, it is customary in many churches to stand to receive Holy Communion. Sitting and standing seem the norms now for worship in spite of all the beautifully embroidered kneelers that many churches boast. But open the Book of Common Prayer, and there is a multitude of rubrics on kneeling whenever people gather for services. It is a posture that takes us back to those vivid images of Jesus praying on his knees in St Luke's Gospel, Peter kneeling to pray in Lydda, and the people kneeling on the beach with Paul in Acts 21.

The Psalmist invites us to kneel before the Lord our Maker, and Paul wrote to the Philippians, 'At the name of Jesus every knee should bend.' As we kneel at the Jacobean railings of St Nicholas, Compton or in our own churches, we are heirs to that tradition. Cranmer in the Prayer Book said that kneeling was a sign of gratitude for benefits received. But it is more than that. Buildings like Compton church bring us to our knees quite naturally as we gaze and wonder at the beauty and majesty of the building. Kneeling is a sign of reverence and adoration of the God who inspired such architecture of old and who feeds us now in the sacraments.

# Pete Keeble writes CONSTABLE COUNTRY MEDICAL PRACTICE

This is one of the busiest times of the year for the practice and on some days demand can be extremely high. Since last September we have operated a triage system. When all our doctor appointments are full, and you feel you need to speak with a doctor, you will be placed on a list for the doctor to phone you back and either address your problem over the phone or ask you to attend an appointment later in the day. Each day, one doctor has responsibility for contacting patients added to the list. Some days, this list has extended to over 40 patients and the nominated doctor for that day will contact them all in addition to their morning surgery and dealing with the clinical administration work (test results and letters from the hospital relating to patients they have referred).

Many of the problems patients present with can be addressed by our excellent Nurse Practitioners and our Minor Illness Nurse. Many of their appointments are pre-bookable as well. These include problems such as cough/colds, rashes, headache, earache, minor injuries, conjunctivitis etc. Our reception team can advise on whether our nurses can treat you. The CCG have recently issued guidelines on prescribing gluten free products. These can no longer be prescribed for patients over 18 years old, and only in limited quantities for patients under 18.

Our clinicians have also been asked to reduce antibiotic prescribing. This is because many viruses are becoming more resistant to antibiotics and very few new antibiotics have been discovered over the last 20 year or so.

Those of you who have visited us over the last year may have already filled in the NHS initiative, 'Friends & Family Test' (FFT) survey. Our contract requires us to both offer it to patients and then report the findings to them on a monthly basis. It is essentially one question – 'How likely

are you to recommend our GP Practice or hospital?' Your responses can be very useful for the practice.

Overwhelmingly, patients here choose extremely likely or likely, which is very pleasing.

We have just completed our FFT return for January. We had 32 completed forms, of which 26 (81%) said it was extremely likely they would recommend the practice to others and a further 5 (16%) said they were likely

to do so. Only one person said that they were unlikely to recommend the surgery, but they chose not to add any comment as to why.

Lovely statements were made about the helpfulness of the staff and the professionalism and caring nature of the doc-

tors and nurses. Please do not feel that this is your only forum for raising issues. I am more than happy to talk to you about suggestions or grumbles that you may have.

### Allie Passfield writes HEALTH WATCH ESSEX

Healthwatch Essex is a registered charity and was formed as a result of the Health and Social Care Act 2012, to promote and support the involvement of the people of Essex in commissioning, provision and scrutiny of local care services. We do this in three different ways; by research, engagement and provision of an Information Service. Our results are used to feed-back to those responsible for provision, managing and scrutinising local care services.

The section I work for, the Information Service, is a telephone,

email and letter based service for the whole of Essex. We give information on how people can access, navigate and understand the provision of health and social care in their area. We give information on a variety of topics, but mainly:- how to access GP services/dentists/opticians/emergency practitioners, how to comment on hospital services, entitlement to carer's assessments, availability of support and advocacy services in Essex.

We also give information on how to make a complaint about services in your area, and how to feedback compliments and suggestions. I am keen for the people of Essex to be aware of the work we do, and to have access to information around health and social care services, how to access this and where to find further information if necessary.
