Preparing to Read Ruth – A Reading Plan

Ruth is rich in allusion to other sections of the Old Testament. You can get ready to read Ruth by using this twenty-day reading plan which will immerse you in the biblical material that the original readers would have been familiar with. We've usually included a question or two to help you focus on some aspect of the passage that is particularly pertinent to Ruth.

Genesis 29:31–30:24	1	What is the character of the two women who become the matriarchs of Israel?
Genesis 19:30–38	2	In what way do Lot's daughters seduce their father? Why?
Genesis 38:1–30	3	Why does Tamar trick her father-in-law? Why might she later be seen as having done an admirable thing?
Genesis 45:27–46:4	4	On what basis does Jacob decide to escape the famine by going down to Egypt?
Exodus 6:1–8	5	This is the first time God presents himself explicitly as the one who redeems. What parallels do you see between verse 7 and Ruth's words in Ruth 1:16?
Leviticus 25	6	What provisions does God make for the poor and to ensure the long- term ownership of land by its original owners?
Numbers 27:8–11 & 36:1–12	7	What happens to land that is sold outside the original family?
Deuteronomy 25:5–10	8	How might the practice of levirate marriage serve a widow's interests?
Judges 4:1–24: Deborah & Barak	9	How does God act and why? Among the major judges, Deborah is the only one the book doesn't criticise. What do you notice about her character?
Judges 6:1–40: Gideon	10	What pattern in Israel's behaviour and God's response do you see?

Judges 10:6–11:11 Jephthah	11	Jephthah is God's man, but how would you describe his character?
Judges 11:12–40 Jephthah's daughter	12	How would you describe her character and the plight of women in that culture?
Judges 13:1–24 Samson	13	Why does God raise up Samson? What do you notice about Samson's mother's understanding of God?
1 Samuel 1:1–28	14	Hannah and the birth of Samuel. What do we learn about the anguish of infertility here?
1 Samuel 16:1–13	15	The anointing of David.
1 Samuel 17:20–51	16	David's first victory. What kind of man is this?
2 Samuel 7:1–16	17	David has been crowned king. What does God now promise?
2 Samuel 22:1–51	18	The scope of God's grace to David and the achievements of his reign. Why might the people have admired him so much?
Psalm 136	19	'Love' here is a translation of the Hebrew word <i>chesed</i> . In what ways does God show his <i>chesed</i> in the Psalm?
Proverbs 31:10–31	20	What qualities do you see in this remarkable woman who is given the same high accolade as Ruth – woman of noble character (<i>chail</i> in Hebrew)?
