A Policeman's Tale

It was suggested to me a few weeks ago that I should consider writing an article for the Dedham Parish Magazine about my years as Dedham's village policeman. Covid lockdown was clearly having its effect on that individual.

Where to start is always challenging as my police career started back in 1980 when my family returned to England having worked in Belgium for the previous 6 years. I was 29 years old at the time so considered a "late starter" so I had time to make up.

My first posting after training was to Leigh on Sea, a pretty and busy town near Southend on Sea famous for its cockle sheds. During my time at Leigh, I spent 6 months with colleagues in Nottingham during the Miners industrial action. This was never the best only the worst of times" I took the opportunity to go down a mine at Ollerton, and came up a few hours later thinking, "Give them the money, they deserve it". Of course, it was not about money, but jobs and family security. Several years later Pat and I

were returning home from York and saw the signpost to Ollerton, so I thought a quick visit would be in order. I arrived at where the pit head at Ollerton should have been, but now it was a Tesco supermarket. I remember a man being killed at the gates to the pit. A sad reminder of human tragedy.

At the time my wife Patricia and I had 4 young children and I was offered a posting to a village in north Essex. The village of course was Dedham. I think the television series Heartbeat was being shown and being part of a community appealed to me. During March 1985 Pat and I drove from Leigh to Dedham and surveyed the village and of course the police house in Crown Street. My initial thoughts were "I could do this". So I accepted the posting and my first "on duty" was scheduled for the early May Bank holiday.

I remember standing on the corner of High Street and Mill Lane when a welldressed gentleman came out of the Essex Rose Tea room and introduced himself as Del. He then proceeded to educate me on the pros and cons of parking in Mill Lane. A few hours later I returned to the same corner having surveyed the chaos and thought, "What have I done"? Parking in Dedham was to become a career long challenge.

My family had settled in well and Pat and I agreed we would never have open or closed on the police station, which I may have regretted once or twice in the years to come.

School visits: I especially enjoyed my frequent visits to Dedham Primary School, mostly at tea break. I would listen to the staff and of course the Head Teacher Mr Mick Atkins. We didn't always agree, but did share many similar views. If I was in a trench Mick is one person I would want by my side.

Horsing around: On this particular day I was at home but not due on duty until 6pm when there was a knock on the door. I answered and a distressed lady informed me that her horse had been bitten. That conjured up all sorts of thoughts but the lady quickly informed me, to my relief that it was by another horse. I was still puzzled as to what I could do for her, or the horse, which was in a nearby horse box. Apparently, she had no vehicle to convey the horse to the vet, well on my drive was a police Vauxhall Chevette. For those readers who remember such a vehicle will know that vehicle wouldn't tow a bicycle, let alone a horse box. I knew a local farmer to whom I explained my

predicament and he was kind enough to let me use his 4 x 4 to take the horse to the vet. A quick phone call to my police control and off we went to NEWMARKET. I returned after midnight and the job was done. Oh, and the horse made a full recovery.

Show us the bodies: I commenced my duties at 6pm and received a phone call from my colleague that he had dealt with an incident of a worrying sheep in Dedham. investigation was passed to me. I contacted the farmer who listed the sheep that had died and those that needed veterinary care. The farmer had buried the dead sheep so I was unable to confirm all the facts. I did however manage to find the dog in a neighbouring village and spoke with the owner. The case began to escalate as the owner did not accept the facts presented and produced a letter from a breeder stating that her breed of dog was "harmless" and would not attack sheep. Well, I was always up for a challenge and I located a specialist breeder in Sittingbourne, Kent. So, another day out. Was that going to be the end of it? No. the defence council demanded to confirm that sheep had actually been killed. So, I contacted a "Scenes of Crime" officer who was tasked with presenting photographs of the deceased sheep. I'm sure to this day the officer has never forgiven me!

Day off: No such thing for a village policeman, or so I thought. Langham Primary School was holding a fete on my day off. I decided to put in an

appearance so I attended in my police car and suitably attired. And the end of the fete I returned to my police vehicle and was just about to move off when another vehicle approached and the driver lost control hitting my vehicle to the point it was written off. I was uninjured but it took some explaining why I was in a police vehicle on my day off and had managed to have it written off!! The divisional commander was very understanding when he heard it was the Vauxhall Chevette.

Not all rosy: I received reports that garden machinery was being stolen from garden sheds in Dedham. With the help of a colleague, we carried out a patrol and arrested a suspect. We believed there was a 2nd man who we were unable to locate. Pat telephoned the police control to report that a man was in my office stating his van had been stolen. Well, that man in my office was the 2nd suspect. It was quickly resolved, but could have had a different outcome.

This is my home: Sitting in my office when I heard a commotion outside. I opened my office door and in fell 2 men. I asked what was going on and received a mumbled reply that it concerned a woman that had caught the attention of them both. The men were local and a little intoxicated. The fighting continued, albeit of the "paper bag" variety. I reminded the men that this was my home and my wife was next door. The men retired sheepishly, only to return the next day with flowers and chocolates for my wife.

VIP for the day: I walked into the office at Mistley Police Station to be asked by the sergeant whether I had any plans for the day. Well, that's usually followed by some request to volunteer for one task or another. I thought let's wait and see. Well, it wasn't really a request from the sergeant, I was going to collect a prisoner from SCOTLAND. "I'm not driving", I said in despair, "I will go by train". "No" was his reply, "you can go by plane". Well, how could I refuse! Chauffeur driven to Stansted, ticket waiting for me. Does it get any better? Of course, it does, a land rover was waiting by the plane on arrival in Glasgow, which drove me to Strathclyde police station. Collect the paperwork, and handcuff the prisoner for the return flight. Driven to the awaiting plane, other passengers were held back whilst we boarded first and settled at the back of the plane. An hour later we were with our chauffeur who had waited patiently for our return. You never quite know as a police officer what the day will bring.

Best job: By now, being the Dedham policemen had a certain kudos as it was recognised as being the best policing job in Essex. I suppose it depends on your own definition. To walk out of your front door and engage with people you have got to know over the years is priceless. The role of a policeman in Dedham came to the notice of a national newspaper who gave me my few minutes of fame by publishing the photograph of me walking along the river bank.

Moving on: By the year 2000 the days of a village policeman in Essex was coming to an end. Centralised policing was the way forward or so it seemed. History may tell a different story, maybe long after I'm gone. I can only reflect on the best years of my working life and will be forever thankful to have worked and met so many decent and caring people. With the closure of the Dedham Police Station, I was transferred to Colchester where after 18 months I was promoted to Sergeant and faced a different challenge.

It was pointed out that I was on the Gone were the days of a chat in the street with a local, or perhaps drop in for a cuppa, no time. Crime and criminals had taken on a different. more sinister appearance. It had become a faceless society, which helped me look forward to my retirement in 2006.


Dedham's West End Part 2

The White House, dating from the eighteenth century, was partially destroyed in the 1930s when it was bought by Cyril Woods, Director of the Colchester firm Woods who were manufacturers of small electric motors and propeller fans. He removed the upper storeys leaving only the ground floor with a loft above it and turned the western half into a garage for the Croft, a large new house which he built on the back garden. During WW2 two surviving ground floor rooms to the left of the front door were used on Thursday afternoons from 3 to 4.30 as War Work Rooms for knitting and sewing sessions. Then and for some years afterwards they were also used as classrooms by Littlegarth School. When Allan and Gaye Drummond moved into the house in 1994 they made bedrooms with dormer windows inside the existing attic but in 2007, after they had left, the top of the house was demolished once again and replaced by the present upper storeys and a redesigned roof.

When William Ephraim Topsfield Cottee came to Dedham he was employed as a steam-roller driver working on road repairs in this area for a firm at Rochford. In 1911 he married Julia Hunnaballs and soon afterwards bought Rose Cottage on the Stratford Road where their three children grew up. Being a motor and cycle engineer he leased the forge next door to the

White House, which had been the premises of a blacksmith called Rogers, and established the West End Garage. John lennings recalled that the eastern end with its own door and window on to the street had previously been an ice cream shop run by Italians, who had a motorbike with a sidecar to take their wares round the district. Cornets cost a penny and there was a special device for sandwiching the two penny wafers. These were made by putting the bottom wafer into the machine, then the ice cream was squeezed in on top before a lever brought the upper wafer down and fixed it into position. After the shop closed an ice cream sign still survived inside the garage workshop.

In the mid 1930s William Cottee bought the plot opposite his garage with the bungalow on it and he set up petrol pumps along the side. He also built lock-up garages, later incorporated into the workshop which his daughter Betty's husband George Southgate established on the land at the back. In 1937 William asked his son lim, who had spent nine years working on a sheep station near Inverell in Australia, to come home and take over the running of the business. William and Julia lived in the bungalow, which they named Inverell after that town in New South Wales and when they married in 1939 Jim and his wife Mabel moved into West End Cottage opposite. They had two sons, Anthony who worked in the garage straight from school, qualifyang as a mechanic at technical college through the day-release scheme and

who joined him in 1972 after service in the RAF. Jim was in charge of the garage from the late 1930s, except during WW2 while he was serving in the RAF. He did not just work as a mechanic but turned his hand to a whole range of other jobs such as mending bicycles or lawnmowers, delivering paraffin and running a local taxi service which included a weekly school run and long-distance journeys for local residents, increasingly undertaken by Anthony.

He leased the garage at Stratford St Mary from Shell, who sold it to the Cottees in the 1960s when petrol sales fell after the new A12 bypass diverted most of the through traffic. They parted with it in 1980 after George Southgate's death, when they were able to use his former workshop in Dedham. Jim Cottee died aged only fifty-five in 1969 but Mabel lived until 2005 and was still helping with serving petrol well into her 80s. Anthony's wife Georgina was in charge of the office from 1968 until the garage closed down and was sold in 2015.

The main part of its High Street workshop has become a garage for the White House with a flat built above it. The remaining space and Mabel's West End Cottage have been replaced by two small houses, Cottee's Cottage and West End Cottage. The workshop behind the bungalow opposite has recently been demolished and a new house is being built on the site. Only the Phoenix petrol sign in front of Inverell remains as a reminder of the

West End Garage, much valued and fondly remembered by many of Dedham's older inhabitants.

The last house next to the Cottees' original premises is now called Wordley Cottage after William Wordley who lived there with his wife Edith, their son Reginald and daughters Gladys and Marion, who did not marry and outlived the rest of the family by many years. When I remember them Gladys could be seen walking to Stratford St Mary every day to catch the bus to loswich. where she worked at Alderton's shoe shop in the Buttermarket and Marion was housekeeper to Jack Spearing, retired owner of Dedham's renowned grocery. Behind their house Hall Cottage beside the Assembly Rooms was built by the Church between the wars to provide a house for the Verger and Caretaker. In 1939 he was the aptly -named Francis Godbold who lived there with his widowed sister and her two schoolboy sons.

Hello, my name is Claire and I am a 4I year old mum of two and Dedham local (coming up to 8 years!)





Prior to lockdown I was a mobile therapist, however through Covid it became apparent that my next step was to create a safe space within my home to offer treatments from. Reflexology is based on the belief that our feet and hands hold an energetic map to our body systems, this dates back thousands of years and is even depicted in Egyptian hieroglyphics.

Even from as little as a single treatment and If you are someone who doesn't enjoy their feet being touched, there are always the hands to work on as an alternative

Reflexology is a wonderful tool which can be used alongside many other methods to help bring us back to the present moment, unblocking and drawing our attention to what our body is really trying to tell us. Pruning and pinching

How did June arrive so quickly? It feels like I've barely started and – not to depress anyone – the longest day is almost upon us. From there it's a downhill slide to Christmas.

Fortunately, a look round the garden offers plenty to cheer one up: the roses are in full bloom in shades of red, pink, white and yellow (I heard that! There's nothing wrong with yellow); deep indigo spires of delphiniums; jewel-coloured clematis wired to walls; glossy, rich crimson Turk's cap lily (*Lilium martagon*) 'Claude Shride'; and foxgloves — lots and lots of self-seeded spikes of purple, creamy pink and white.

There's also plenty of pruning. Some of the garden has gone over by now and June is a good time to prune spring-flowering shrubs, now they've finished their show. These include Kolkwitzia and Philadelphus, as well as, in my garden, flowering currant (Ribes sanguineum), Weigela 'Bristol Ruby' and a couple of unknown Deutzia plants. These flower on the previous year's wood, so pruning now gives new growth over the summer enough time to ripen sufficiently to flower well next year.

I'll also take my secateurs to the *Spiraea* 'Arguta' (also called bridal wreath), which you'll remember from the April issue and has finished its spectacular display. It's a fairly mature specimen, so the idea is to cut back about one in three of the older, fatter stems to encourage new growth from the base



and shorten other flowered stems to help it bush out, neaten it up or reduce the height and spread.

Now that all that frost is done with (finally), you can also cut back tender shrubs such as *Penstemon* and hardy fuchsias. The former doesn't do well in my garden and I think the "frostiest April for 60 years" has done for most of them, but perhaps I just need to find the right place for it. I have a much hardier *Fuchsia magellanica* var. gracilis

'Aurea' with golden leaves and simple scarlet and purple flowers; I take stems back by about a third now to encourage bushier growth.

Perennial Oriental poppies (*Papaver orientale*) look mess after they've flowered, so cut the whole lot right back to the ground. Follow with mulch and a feed (liquid tomato feed is fine) to stimulate the growth of fresh new foliage and possibly even a second flush of flowers. You can do the same with hardy *Geranium* (the cranesbill) without which no garden is complete.

I'm going to try something new with a few of my hybrid tea roses: disbudding. Remove all the smaller buds from the cluster that forms at the shoot tip, leaving the largest one in the centre. If the flowers are as 'show-stopping' as some say, maybe they'll win me some points should the Society's Autumn Show be able to go ahead in September.

While May had its Chelsea chop in the borders, in my mini-orchard there's the June drop, when trees naturally shed

some fruit and I can thin overcongested branches for bigger fruits. I'm pinching out the side shoots of my tomato plants on the allotment: you only need to do this on cordon – also called indeterminate – varieties, which should be grown up a single stem. Bush tomatoes are more shrub-like and don't need it.

It's not just cutting though. June is also the time to sow biennials which put down strong roots this year and flower in the next. I'm going to try germinating wallflowers, foxgloves and beautiful umbellifer *Daucus carota*, the wild carrot. By the end of summer, I should be able to plant them out into the garden, giving them chance to get established before winter.

All this pruning and pinching is certainly hard work, so don't forget to relax, give yourself a pat on the back, enjoy the fruits of your labour whenever you can.




