

A reflection on Faith



Joseph Chilton Pearce, an American writer on human development, famously said that 'we are shaped by each other.' I am certainly conscious of those who have shaped, challenged, and

inspired me. There are three people who stand out in particular: Andrew, Pete, and Jackie. I grew up in the town of Chipping Sodbury, 12 miles northeast of Bristol.

My primary school was in the nearby town of Yate and my parents, who both worked, would drop me off at school before anyone else had turned up. The caretaker, Mr Andrew Rooks, was always on hand to look after me. He was a kindly man, dressed in stockman overalls and often whistling a happy tune. He had a packet of polo mints in his pocket in case someone needed cheering up — and he was always ready with a listening ear and some good and wise advice. He was the most gentle, kind, and joyful man I knew.

On the last day of term in my final year, we collected autographs from fellow pupils and staff – and I asked Mr Rooks for his autograph. He wrote: 'A Rooks. The Lord is my shepherd'. At that moment, the source of his gentleness, kindness and joy was made clear.

My vicar growing up was a somewhat eccentric character; the Reverend Barry Marshall Palmer Palmer ffynché. Church was fairly traditional, and all the exciting things seemed to happen at the far end -

beyond where the elderly choir used to help each other into the choir stalls. I believed in God – but had a sense that God preferred to keep an eye on things from a distance.

When I was a teenager, I began attending a Methodist Chapel that had undergone something of a revival during the Billy Graham Mission of 1984. Whereas my Anglican Church were still coming to terms with the Peace, these Methodists hugged each other. And the organ and choir had given way to a worship band. But perhaps the most striking thing of all was the fact that the Methodists kept talking about Jesus with a familiarity that intrigued me. Chief among these was a former merchant naval officer named Pete. He challenged me to pick up my much-neglected Bible and I well remember reading John chapter 3 on the bus home one evening – and realising that, far from keeping his distance, Jesus was as close as close can be.

Aged 18, I found myself studying Chemistry at Imperial College. Towards the end of my first year, I went to my local church (Holy Trinity Brompton) to hear Jackie Pullinger speak. She told us of her remarkable ministry in Hong Kong and how we needed to have soft hearts and hard feet (open to be moved by those in need – and determined enough to do something about their situation). I returned to my student room with my legs shaking. I knew that I had to do something about what I had heard – even if it meant leaving behind a promising career in Chemistry. Andrew, Pete and Jackie certainly shaped my life - and I thank God for them. I also pray that God may use each of us to shape, challenge and inspire others.

MY CHRISTIAN FAITH

I hope you enjoyed the Queen's Platinum Jubilee Celebrations. It reminded me of the most significant event in my childhood. In the year of the Queen's Coronation, I was chosen to be the Coronation Rose Queen for our Parish Whit Walk. In Lancashire, this was a Sunday School Movement tradition in recognition and remembrance of St Agnes.

The Church of England Whit Walks took place on Whit Monday. Led by a brass band, first walked the vicar and choir with church banner flying. Then followed the Sunday School children with their banner, the new Rose Queen and her attendants, the retiring Rose Queen and her attendants, the Mothers Union with their banner, the men's Church support group, and lastly, anyone in the congregation who also wanted to sing the Lords praises at various stops along the way.

When the parade had finished, the partying began, with afternoon tea and band concert on the school playing field. Later in the evening, there was dancing in the school room. The day was the highlight of the year for both village churchgoers and non-churchgoers. Many of the latter had lined the streets and cheered on the procession year after year.

My faith at this time was totally accepting of everything I was taught about who Jesus was, His preaching and His miracles: His life and death and resurrection. I'd been baptised, recently confirmed by the Bishop of Manchester, sang in the choir, read the lessons at church services and helped out at the Sunday School.

My young life wasn't all about faith though. As a complete tomboy, I played out in all weathers, roaming the countryside, in any gang that would have me. I was one of the best apple scrumpers in the village.

In those post war years, we needed that faith. My best friend Kathleen, aged 6, was killed in a tragic accident. Another friend's mother died from TB. Also, there was a lot of post war poverty in the village. Families suffered hardship.

I believe faith is a journey. I feel lucky my mother started me on that journey at a young age. However, that faith has been questioned quite a bit over the years. My church attendance has fluctuated for various reasons.

In my 30s, I began to seriously question the Church's attitude towards women. We were damned if pregnant before marriage, damned for having an abortion, and had to be 'cleansed' after giving birth. And don't mention divorce!

But the lack of women clergy annoyed me most. Women were so active in church life. Why was there so little respect for them? I became a member of The Movement for the Ordination of Women. Slowly, things changed.

About this time, I had a deeply disturbing spiritual experience when I 'died' under general anaesthetic. I kept going over in my mind, why had I had this experience. Why was I asked 'what is Jesus's other name'? Why did my life flash before me? Why the tunnel and the light?

I was on a Heparin drip for a week, Warfarin for 5 months, and suffered spontaneous pneumothorax for over a year. Having two young children, it was a very anxious time.

MY CHRISTIAN FAITH

When I'm asked to talk about my faith, having had the near-death experience I have to speak about it. It's an experience you can't ignore.

Sometime later, when I was in Church listening to the bible readings, I heard 'We shall call him Emmanuel, which means God is with us.' Then followed a reading about when Jesus was asked which were the two greatest commandments. Jesus said: 'Love God with all your heart, with all your soul and with all your mind' and 'Love your neighbour as yourself'. I felt suddenly very at peace. I could move on.

Time and again, recorded in the New Testament, Jesus emphasised the need for people to love as He loves and to love one another. He chose working men for his disciples, showed great respect for women and treated Jewish and non-Jewish people the same. He reached out to ordinary people. This teaching of Jesus and His example became the basis of my adult Christian Faith.

Years later, it encouraged me to train as a licenced Pastoral Assistant for our church in the Peterborough diocese when it was about to become part of a large benefice. I used to help run the Alpha Courses as part of my role. Many of the people I was called to support wanted reassurance about their faith.

I feel really blessed to be living in Dedham. I've always been happiest living in a friendly village where the church has parishioners actively giving support to the community. I try to play my part, though I'm not quite as active as I was. When I can't help, I pray for God's intervention, especially if I see injustice or distress in the life of others. We have inspirational preaching and wonderful music at church services.

God be with you.

MY GUIDE DOG TRAINING EXPERIENCE



I was really pleased to be asked to write about my volunteering role within Guide Dogs. I am a Dedham girl, born in Rose Cottage, Stratford Road, then moving down the road to Old Orchard, living there until my marriage and move to Lawford. My family are true Dedhamites, living locally for a few hundred years with my grandfather moving from Langham to Dedham in 1891 and family members living here ever since. Attending Dedham church Sunday school from an early age was I am sure a good grounding for wanting to help people.

In 1963 as the leader of Stratford St Mary and Higham Girl Guides we started collecting foil milk bottle tops the proceeds from their sale being donated to Guide Dogs for the Blind. From little acorns mighty oaks grow and today I am still heavily involved in volunteering in many ways for the charity. At first I was happy helping but always wanted to do more by being a Puppy walker. This was put on hold for 20 years as the nearest Training centre at that time was Leamington Spa.

Marriage and growing family took precedence until my dream became a reality. With a new Training centre built at Woodford Green and my youngest son 3 years old, I was able to start my puppy walking journey. August 1988 my first guide dog pup arrived, a little black Labrador called Luke. Now on pup number 30 I have another black Labrador called Carlo.

We have the pups when they are 7 weeks old just as mischievous as any other puppy. Firstly the important thing is to bond with them, get them to respond to their name, then the house training, which some pups 'get the message' quicker than others! 'Busy' is the word we use for this. All we do with our pups is done gradually at the pups pace in a positive way. Patience is a key word.

When vaccinated our pups start their journey by being introduced to our big noisy outside world not realising we are preparing them to be life changing Guide Dogs. Our pups get used to all noises and happenings of every day life, visiting various places, especially attending church where the acoustics are very different, hearing organ music and singing are good for them to gain experience. Riding in all modes of transport, firstly they travel in our car then when ready we take them on buses and trains. To start with we just watch. I have spent many hours on Manningtree railway platform watching trains!!

Our first train ride is then on the quieter Mayflower line to Harwich. Gradually we build up to busier areas visiting towns and going in shops.

MY GUIDE DOG TRAINING EXPERIENCE

Unlike qualified Guide Dogs our pups do not have automatic right to enter shops and other public places but I have had very few refusals in 34 years, people understanding the importance of our pups gaining experience for later in their lives.

Like a pet pup there is lots for them to learn, but with our guide dog pups learning self control is important as no guide dog owner wants a dog helping themselves to goods off a shop shelf. Discouraging picking up food from pavements is important, resisting temptations by making ourselves more interesting and getting their attention. As a speaker for Guide Dogs when old enough my pups come with me to lots of different organisations and meetings.

It is important for our pups to experience all every day activities and also for us as puppy walkers to experience happenings that could be embarrassing. One example when exiting the 'ladies' after being heard to say "Good boy, sit". One does gets some strange looks!. Poo bags are always at the ready, on taking a tissue out of your pocket, (maybe in church) a poo bag comes to!

Our pups like all guide dogs work hard and play hard. They have 3 free runs each week, so important for them to relax and play which they all love. This continues until the pups reach 14/15 months old when it's time for them to attend Guide dog school or in some cases join the breeding stock which selects dogs with the qualities needed for guide dog work. Guide dogs breed nearly all their own dogs having brood bitches and stud dogs living as the pups do in volunteer homes, visiting the excellent equipped Breeding Centre at the required times.


The dogs health and well being is of paramount importance and bitches have the maximum of 3 or 4 litters.

Back to school the pups will learn guiding ways and to think for themselves. At the training centre there is an obstacle course, and other work aids plus the trainers take the pups out to gain more experiences. An important part of school is the free run area for fun and relaxation.

Moving to senior level the dogs are matched with a visually impaired person whose needs they can fulfil. Speed of walking, place of home and work of their owner are all considered. Like humans all dogs are different, some much prefer the countryside others preferring the hustle and bustle of town/city life.

Excellent training is given to all guide dog owners and routes are learnt to enable them to live independent lives as sighted people do.

MY GUIDE DOG TRAINING EXPERIENCE

Like our other pups Carlo arrived at 7 weeks old, leaving his siblings to start his new life. Although we had disturbed sleep at night he always asked to go out to relieve himself so we had few 'accidents'. He has grown up with and is great friends with my bantams and ducks, happily sharing the garden with the ducks, never chasing them. As he has grown up he has gradually experienced a lot working to the level he is now. Travelled on buses, trains, heard lots of different noises and much more. He has visited schools, brownies, WI meetings and regularly goes to the Coffee Mornings in the Duchy Barn as well as the Friendship group at Ardleigh Church. Plus of course attending church services at Dedham and Ardleigh.

Recently Carlo came with us to a steam traction engine 'Crank Up'. He took it all in his stride, lots of people, dogs and of course many traction engines in full steam going along near him. The latest experience was standing on the playing field watching and listening to the fly past for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. No reactions, Carlo was possibly thinking he would rather have a free run, (no, not there and then, later!)

I have just been told that Carlo may leave us to attend school at the end of June. What a sad day that will be, but I have to look further on. During his schooling I will receive reports on his progress, hopefully meet him before he qualifies and the 'icing on the cake' hear from and maybe even meet his future owner. He will be a life changer!!

One thing that encourages me to keep going is remembering my friend who after going blind had no confidence to leave her house alone.

With her husband at work all day, her 2 sons at school and college the only time out was in the evenings and at weekends. This went on for 8 years until she had her first Guide dog when she went out every day!! I do so hope and pray Carlo can be a life changer like that.

My faith and church are important to me and I feel all those years ago I had a 'calling' to help in this way and give thanks to God and the many people who have helped me on my journey. Sunday school at St.Mary's Dedham was my foundation. Many many thanks.

GARDENING NOTES

Let's put on (another) show!

It's June as I write this and the garden is lush and green with flowers. Although it looks beautiful, most of my activities focus on weeding, supporting, pruning and cutting back.

It's not very exciting or interesting, so I thought instead I'd look ahead to our Autumn Show on Saturday 3rd September at Dedham's Assembly Rooms. Now's a great time to help you think about submitting an entry or two. There's no cost to enter and you don't need to be a member of the Society.

The autumn show schedule has separate sections dedicated to fruit and vegetables, as well as flowers, floral art, cookery and photography which we see in spring. In several of these classes you'll need to exhibit 3, 5, sometimes 10 of a kind, which can be harder than you think. However there are plenty of classes which if you have a small garden or just pots and containers, you can enter and have a chance to win!

You can exhibit 'a vase of mixed herbs' and only need three varieties. Chances are there's a some basil on a window ledge or mint or chives. You might have sage, a lavender shrub or rosemary bush in a pot outside. If so, then gather some sprigs for the vase you are using; any number can be used, but make sure you exhibit three different kinds of herbs.

You'll need to find 10 of the same cultivar to enter the blackberries or raspberries classes and they'll need to look as near-identical as possible. The advantage of blackberries though is that you can use hedgerow varieties – so you don't even need to grow them in your garden or allotment to enter this class!



It also means you don't need to worry about cultivars: just raid as many brambles as you can get to.

Remember to keep the stalks on though – the exhibiting world has a great fear of supermarket perfection accidentally making it onto the show bench.

Now. Flowers. If our spring show is all about daffodils and bulbs, autumn is all about the dahlia and the rose. There are five classes for dahlias and it's worth doing a bit of reading to understand the difference between them. Beginners might prefer to avoid the pompon class. It is not easy to tell the difference between pompon and ball dahlias. Also you should know that 'three single blooms' means the shape of the flower not just one flower per stem. Instead, if it's your first time I think the best dahlia class is 'two vases, three blooms in each, any cultivar(s)' as it's the most flexible. Although it's not specifically stated, most (but not all) exhibitors make the content of each vase identical.

GARDENING NOTES



You could try six of the same dahlia or two each of three different kinds. The best thing is that you don't need to know the difference between decorative, cactus, pompon or ball, you just need to take them from the same plant.

The rose section is another that anyone should feel able to enter. There are roses for containers and small spaces as well as the border, but know that this section is highly competitive among your fellow villagers. You could do a bit of research into the different kinds – the hybrid tea (HT), the floribunda (clusters of blooms on a stem) and shrub – but you don't need to do that if you enter 'five roses in a vase'. They can be any kind and any colours, just make sure there's five. Give 'em a bit of a zuzh and you're done!



There are plenty of other classes and if you can't grow, then bake or submit a photo instead. It's only a village show at the end of the day (yes, any old vase really will do). So don't be shy, give it a go. It's free to enter and we'd love to see you.

Constable Country Medical Practice – Practice Update June 2022

We are now getting back to normal following the pandemic. However, we can't be complacent as Coronavirus is still in the community and we could be affected by new variants. We have reopened our waiting areas but please continue to socially distance and wear a face mask whilst inside the building. We continue to operate a telephone triage system when patients need to speak to one of our doctors or advanced nurse practitioners. They will phone to discuss your problem and arrange to see you in person the same day if they need to. This on-the-day system has been in operation since before that pandemic and, based on patient feedback, works well. Please note that we have an extended team of clinicians including a pharmacist, paramedic and practice nurses. Our reception team will refer you to the clinician most suited to addressing your problem. They may also refer you to a local pharmacy if they are best placed to help you.

The preferred method of contacting the practice for non-urgent problems is eConsult. We will respond no later than the end of the next working day, and many issues can be dealt with without the need to speak to a clinician or come to the practice, e.g. referrals, medication issues, fit notes etc. though you will be contacted if we need any further information from you.

Please see our website for further details.

We meet regularly with our Patient Participation Group. They are an invaluable link with patients and help us understand what works well and how we can improve the service we provide. Please send feedback to them via the comment cards available at each practice site or via email. Their contact details are on our website. The PPG are also looking for new members so please contact them directly if you are interested.

Since 2008 Korban has been helping young homeless people in Colchester by giving them a home and supporting them to move on and live independently. Our early intervention helps to break the cycle of homelessness and knock-on effects eg. lost jobs, unfinished education, mental health problems, potential substance abuse and crime. This has a hugely positive effect on the individual, and ultimately the whole community.

During that time we have helped nearly 140 homeless young people, and over the last 5 years nearly 90% of our residents have been supported to move-on positively from Korban - including 4 going to university!

Korban works with young homeless people aged 16-25 to realise their potential and thrive, by providing accommodation, support and guidance enabling them to develop the character, skills and confidence to live independently.

We currently have 2 homes; a 5 bedroom hub house and a 3 bedroom move-on house, providing medium term (2 – 3 years max) supported accommodation for 8 young people aged 16 – 25 years who are homeless or at risk of homelessness.

As a Christian charity we are supported by a number of local churches and St Mary's church Dedham has raised a significant amount of funds for Korban over the last couple of years and members of the church are involved in volunteering. Our partnership with St Mary's is a great blessing to Korban and we want to say big thank you to the church.

RENEWABLE ENERGY

My Career and my journey to a more sustainable life.... From Boat Builder to Renewable Energy Consultant- it all started for me as an electrical / propulsion engineer and later as a Production Manager for Oyster Marine. I built sustainability into every boat we built; after all there are no sockets to plug into when you are sailing across the Atlantic.

In 2002, after 20 years plus in the marine industry, I decided a career change was needed. I could see the years of self-sufficiency research in the marine world could be transposed to homes in the UK. I realized I could save everyone money, reduce our dependency on the national grid and create economic independence for all.

I started working for a local electrical/ heating company who had a few council contracts (Babergh, Colchester Council and even Solihull) to install heat pumps for those in fuel poverty. They later branched out to install solar PV.

In 2013, I started my own Ltd company concentrating on electrical and renewable energy systems. I pooled all my marine knowledge and what I had learnt from the other businesses I worked for, I could then offer everyone a tailored solution to their home's heating and electrical needs, whilst reducing their Carbon footprint.

I'm passionate about protecting the world we live in. I have solar panels and a heat pump in my own home in Dedham. Now that energy prices are so high and expected to rise further I know that I can really help people to run their homes more economically, as well as helping the environment we all live in.



The most affordable way of doing this is through solar panels. However I also install home batteries, heat pumps and car chargers, all of which need careful assessment to make sure they are best suited to your home.

There is an awful amount of misinformation in the industry and there are many questions I am often asked as we install, hopefully these will help you to understand:

My house does not face south can I have solar panels?

Facing south is ideal, however, a house with an east / west split has the benefit of a longer generation period. North facing or flat also works, because after May the sun is high enough to shine on a north facing roof and after all they work on daylight not just sunlight.

Is it worth having solar on the current feed it rates?

The focus on a solar system has changed from purely financial, to now maximizing the generated electric to reduce your grid usage, actually saving more money than any feed in tariff. Pay back is currently 4 -5 years, whilst those on the original feed in tariffs were expecting 8-10 years payback.

What can I do with the generated electric?

Anything you like! However, there are systems available that stop anything going to the grid: hot water generation using a solar controller, battery charging and running your high consumption items during the day i.e. dish washers, washing machines and tumble dryers also stops you having to buy electric to do these tasks.

Where can I put the solar panels? On your roof or on the ground on a frame.

What size of system would you expect me to have on my house and how much does it cost?

An average UK house according to the Government uses 3300 Kwh of energy a year. A 4 Kwh system will generate 3700 Kwh of electricity (weather permitting) and installed and certified would cost approximately £5289.00, with Zero VAT.

Do I need planning permission?

You need to seek planning permission if you are in an AONB, conservation area or own a listed building, in most cases solar falls under the permitted development guidelines.

Can I start with a basic small system and upgrade if I need to?

Yes absolutely, you can start with a small system, 1 kw will make a nice dent in your grid consumption, you can then add as you wish up to 15 Kw pending an application to UKPN.

Is there a limit to the sizing?

Not at all, the largest I have done is 36Kw on a village hall in Suffolk, but generally 4 kw is the standard on a single dwelling.



I take care of any of the applications to UKPN for anything larger. I have lived in Dedham for 35 years and have already fitted a lot of systems here in the village, and locally. I can advise you on what's acceptable to National Grid and the planning department. I am there for you from initial concept to the install, I am more than happy to visit and assess your needs. It's really important to me we balance what is best for you cost wise with the benefits of reducing your energy costs. I can and have also advised on SAP/ EPC levels for new builds, am. currently doing seven new builds in Gt Bromley. I have designed and built them to be an A grade on the EPC and they are carbon neutral from the day of handover assuming all the electric is from renewable suppliers.






