FINANCIAL OVERVIEW

Management: The PCC Finance Committee met on 4 occasions in 2023, and has 5 members: John Reed (Chairman & Treasurer), Peter Wilson (Churchwarden), David Jewell, Adrian Beckingsale (from 9th May), and Sara Marshall (Financial Administrator). The PCC is registered with the Charity Commission under Charity number 1130860, and the Annual Accounts can be viewed on the Dedham Church website (www.dedham-and-ardleigh-parishes.co.uk). Once approved at the APCM, they are available on the Commission's website (www.charitycommission.gov.uk).

Income: 2023 built on the progress made in 2022, and the finances benefitted from strong Church attendances, and additional other giving. The2023 total of Planned and other Giving to the General Fund (Note 2a) including Gift Aid amounted to £89,698, a 13.4% increase on the total for 2022 of £79,074. Despite the continued flat income from monthly standing orders, the donations from all other sources were well ahead of last year, and the PCC wishes to thank everyone who gave so generously in 2023. Other General Fund Income in 2023 (Note 2b), was also positive, with the Parish Magazine generating income of £19,946 from advertisers. The one Fund Raising event in 2023 was the Big Breakfast which raised record income of £2,089.

<u>Grants Received & Fabric projects</u>: Several grants were received in 2023 to support both the church overheads and the Organ Appeal fund, the only Fabric project in 2023 (Note 2g). The Appeal raised another £63,213, which took the total to within 4% of the target of £300,000. Preliminary costs were paid out, mainly to Nicholson & Co totalling £56,031 (after all VAT was reimbursed).

<u>Legacies</u>: Two bequests were gratefully received in 2023, including one for £5,929, with the Will indicating that it should be used for maintaining the Fabric of the Church.

<u>Expenses</u>: The impact of global inflation was very evident in early 2023, and had a major impact on overheads, particularly utility costs, which have now been secured on far more advantageous contracts. This has been a year when a number of one-off or routine maintenance issues have arisen, and this has all led to a sharp rise in Expenses. Church running costs rose by £8,202 (12%) to £76,521.

<u>Parish Share</u>: A revised Diocesan Parish Share system was introduced in 2023 as part of the new Missioner ministry arrangements. This brought substantial relief from the previous out-of-reach Parish "Ask". The 2023 Aspirational level of Parish Share for Dedham was set at £46,623, some £3,877 less than 2022, and it was very pleasing that this year we had enough in General Fund to meet this.

Reserves: The overall funds held by the PCC at 31st December 2023 total £602,724, an increase of £60,506 in the year. The largest fund continues to be the Organ Appeal fund and this now stands at £216,581, sufficient to meet the Organ rebuild this coming Autumn. Apart from the Organ Fund, all other funds increased by a net £46,568 during 2023, compared to a loss of £44,321 reported last year. Fund investments made a gain of £22,572 which recovered 73% of the investment losses in 2022. Whilst the current economy remains uncertain, it is vital that the PCC continues to maintain sufficient funds in the General Reserve to meet future challenges. The strong financial performance in 2023 has resulted in a Cash balance of £27,412 being held in the General Fund at 31st December (2022 £20,470 cash).

In Conclusion, I wish to give my heartfelt thanks to both Sara Marshall and Katrina Ablett for the immense amount of work they put in, diligently and professionally throughout the year.

Notes to the financial statements For the year ended 31 December 2023

1. Accounting polices

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Church Accounting Regulations 2006 together with applicable accounting standards and FRS 102. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention as modified by the inclusion of investments at market value and the revaluation of fixed assets. The financial statements include all transactions, assets and liabilities for which the PCC is responsible in law. They do not include the accounts of church groups that owe their affiliation to another body, nor those which are informal gatherings of church members.

1.1 Funds

Funds are defined as either unrestricted, designated, restricted and endowment (see notes 10-12). Unrestricted funds represent the funds of the PCC (Parochial Church Council) that are not subject to any restrictions regarding their use and are available for application on the general purposes of the PCC. These include funds designated for a purpose by the PCC.

The purpose of any restricted funds is noted in the financial statements.

1.2 Incoming resources

1.2(a) Voluntary Income and Capital Sources

Collections are recognised when made.

Amounts receivable under covenants are recognised only when honoured by the covenantor. Income tax recoverable on covenanted or gift aid donations is included when the income is recognised.

Grants and legacies to the PCC are accounted for as soon as the PCC is notified of its entitlement and the likely amount due.

Fundraising event income is accounted for gross before expenses. Sales of items from the church resource centre are also accounted for gross.

1.2(b) Other Ordinary Income

Rental income from the letting of church premises is accounted for when earned.

Parochial fees due to the PCC for weddings, funerals etc., are accounted for on an event by event basis.

1.2(c) Income from Investments

Dividends and interest are accounted for when due.

1.2(d) Investment gains and losses

Realised gains or losses are recognised when investments are sold. Unrealised gains or losses are accounted for on revaluation of investments at 31 December.

1.3 Application of Resources

1.3(a) Grants

Grants and donations are accounted for when paid, or upon award.

1.3(b) Activities directly relating to the work of the church.

The Diocesan Parish Share (quota) is accounted for when payable and any amount paid after 31 December is shown as a creditor in the Balance Sheet.

1.4 Fixed Assets

1.4(a) Consecrated land and buildings and movable church furnishings.

Consecrated and beneficed property is excluded from the financial statements by section 96(2)(c) of the Charities Act 1993.

No value is placed on movable church furnishings held by the churchwardens on special trust for the PCC and require a faculty for disposal since the PCC considers this to be an inalienable property. All expenditure incurred during the year on consecrated or beneficed buildings and movable church furnishings, whether maintenance or improvement, is written off.

1.4(b) Other land and buildings

Expenditure on maintenance or improvement is written off as incurred.

It is hereby noted that the church's assets include a shared overage on a parcel of land in Coles Oak Lane, Dedham (Land Registry title number EX814136), the value has not been determined at the date of these accounts.

1.4(c) Other fixtures, fittings and office equipment

Equipment used within the church premises is depreciated on a straight line basis over 4 years. A full year's depreciation is charged in the year of acquisition and no charge is made in the year of disposal. Individual items of equipment with a purchase price of £1,000 or less are written off in the year in which the asset is acquired.

1.4(d) Investments

Investments are valued at market value at 31 December.

1.4(e) Current Assets

Amounts owing to the PCC at 31 December in respect of fees, rents or other income are shown as debtors less any provisions for amounts that may prove uncollectable.

Short-term deposits include cash held on deposit either with the Central Board of Finance or at the Bank.

Parts of the Parochial Fees received by the PCC are designated for music, flowers and for maintenance of the tower.

The following are notes in respect of Designated Funds:-

- (a) Tower Fund receives the net income from Tower Tours, for expenditure on the fabric of the Church.
- (b) The Flower Fund has traditionally been generated from a facility fee for flowers at weddings. It is now available for flower arrangers to use as part of their weekly displays.
- (c) Seasonal Frontals Fund is initially for the replacement of the Trinity set of frontals.
- (d) Duchy Barn Fund was merged with the Duchy Parochial Benefit fund in 2014 and is used for the income and running costs of the Duchy Barn.

- (a) Missions Fund income raised are the proceeds from specific fundraising events.
- The Organ Appeal Fund attracted donations and grants totalling £63,213 during the year. The cumulative total donated and granted since July 2022 stood at £289,103 including Gift Aid at the 31st December 2023, representing over 96% of the target. Stage payments to Nicholson & Co, the main contractor, and other costs totalled £56,031 in 2023 excluding VAT reclaimed as a grant from the LPWGS. The annual National IBOB inflationary indexation clause was applied in 1st January 2024, and the amount outstanding on the contract with Nicholson & Co stands at £162,913. The Organ Appeal Fund balance holds £216,581 at the end of 2023 to meet this liability.
- (c) During 2023 £3,389 was charged to the Repairs and Maintenance Fund for upgrading the Lightning conductors and other seucrity measures
- Vicar & Churchwardens Discretionary Fund was started with a donation from an individual and was requested to be used to help people in need in the parish.
- (e) The Churchyard Fund income is used for the costs of churchyard maintenance.
- (f) The Fabric Fund is for repairs to the fabric of the church.
- (g) Heath Fund money released from the Heath sale proceeds fund, to be used by the PCC for the benefit of the Church & Dedham Parish.

I report on the accounts of the PCC for the year ended 31 December 2023, which are set on pages 3 to 12 of the Full Annual Accounts.
