

RURAL MISSIONER

Dear Friends

I hope this finds you well – on the cusp of summer holidays and time enjoying God's good creation with family, friends and loved ones.

At the end of this month, the Church of England remembers William Wilberforce, Olaudah Equiano and Thomas Clarkson and their efforts to abolish the slave trade in the then British Empire.

Olaudah Equiano is possibly the least well known of the three, but he grew up abroad (likely in southern Nigeria) and was himself a slave and traded several times before buying his freedom and ending up in London,

where he became one of the leading figures of the abolitionist movement at the end of the 18th century.

Thomas Clarkson was the son of a clergyman who grew up in Cambridgeshire. After his undergraduate studies in Cambridge, he met many abolitionists who were Quakers and Nonconformists (Protestants other than Anglicans). He began lobbying parliament in aid of the abolitionist cause and, through this, came in contact with William Wilberforce.

Wilberforce was an independent MP for Yorkshire and an Anglican, one of the first Anglicans to take up the abolitionist cause. He was driven by his evangelical faith to do so and was blessed, three days before his death, to witness the fruit of all the abolitionists' labour as Parliament passed the Slavery Abolition Act 1833.

Christian opposition to slavery originates from the teaching found right at the opening of the Bible in Genesis

I:27:"God created mankind in His own image, in the image of God He created them; male and female He created them." The argument is that if God has endowed each and every human being with the immense dignity of bearing His image, then we should not denigrate fellow image-bearers by treating them as 'property'.

It would be easy to think that slavery and human trafficking are issues of the past, but that couldn't be further from the truth. Today, organisations like Stop the Traffik (https://stopthetraffik.org/) continue the legacy of Wilberforce, Equiano and Clarkson in highlighting the magnitude of the present evil and seeking, like these leading lights of former days, to bring it to an end. I commend their work to you!

OLD SPECTACLES FROM DEDHAM HELPING PEOPLE IN SIERRA LEONE

Thank you to the many Dedham residents who have left old spectacles in the Church porch. Two batches have now been shipped to a church run Eye Hospital in the town of Lunsar, Sierra Leone.

Sierra Leone is one of the poorest countries in the world. You will rarely see anyone in Sierra Leone wearing glasses because they cannot afford them.



This lady was a maid at Andy Higginson's hotel in Sierra Leone. A pair of appropriate reading glasses was found from a collection brought over from the UK. She is so happy she can read now. She could not afford to buy glasses. The second photo is of Andy and Dr Laurel Spooner visiting the Eye Hospital in Lunsar.

The glasses are sent to the Eye Hospital where they are sorted by type.

The prescriptions are read on a machine. The Hospital then dispenses the glasses to local residents of Lunsar and the surrounding areas free of charge. People often queue at the Hospital for hours and days to receive their spectacles.

Dr Laurel Spooner, who runs the scheme, has sent this message to the Dedham donors. The doctor in charge of the Eye Hospital in Lunsar, Sierra Leone, where all the glasses go, has asked me to thank you "with all his heart". He says they find a use for everything. "Usually there is a patient to suit the simple lenses or if the lenses are multifocal we reuse the frames. If not reusable we take apart for spares. God Bless you. "Every time we can't find our glasses we experience what life without them would be like.

Many recipients at the Hospital are receiving their first pair. After years of blurred vision they see the world clearly again.



Please donate any glasses you no longer use to citizens of Sierra Leone. Declutter your home at the same time! The collection box is in the Church porch.

A Long Glittering Line: Picture fit for a Queen 21st June – 26th October 2025

A new exhibition at in the historic former home of Sir Alfred Munnings affords a rare chance to see pictures from the Royal Collection and Tate a century on from when they were commissioned by Queen Mary.

In 1925, rising star of the art world, Alfred Munnings was commissioned by Queen Mary to paint the Royal Family arriving at Ascot by horse and carriage for the racing in June.

Excited by the challenge, Munnings was also enthralled by the pomp and colour of the State Procession which he described later in his autobiography as "a long glittering line".

Dedham Parish Council - Report of Meeting on 2nd June 2025

Visitor's Report from Councillor Barber

The results of the parking survey were noted.

Concerns were raised regarding delays to Education, Health, and Care certificates for pupils at the primary school, impacting their education.

Anti-Social Behaviour by Young People

The Council noted evidence of young people gathering in Dedham for parties by the river and on playing fields.

A special meeting will be convened with interested parties to develop a strategy to address these issues.

Trading on Pavements in the High Street

This continues to be a problem, particularly for residents requiring wider pavements due to disability or with young children.

The Council will contact traders and seek legal clarification.

Terms of Reference for Groups

These will be finalised at the next meeting.

Parish Plan

The Council is commencing the development of a new Parish Plan. A consultation day for residents is planned for July 19th, 10 am - 4 pm, at the Duchy Barn.

Planning

The planning group now meets prior to each Council meeting (6:00 pm - 6:30 pm). The first meeting discussed recent planning applications.

A comment will be made on the proposed Birchwood Road Starbucks drive-through development.

The planned housing development off Long Road West will be monitored in partnership with local residents.

Parking Update

Meetings are scheduled with NEPP to discuss camper van parking, disabled bay usage, main car park tidying, and yellow line repainting.

The Council will raise with Stratford St. Mary Parish Council and Babergh Council the need for uninterrupted yellow lines over the bridge.

Children's Play Area

Urgent repairs to the climbing frame were approved.

Consultation on Bus Service Rerouting (80/81A - Mill Road and Turner Road)

It was noted that proposed changes to serve Olympic Boulevard and Northern Approach in Colchester could negatively impact residents relying on the bus for Colchester Hospital, as the new stop would be distant from the main entrance.

Contracts for Playing Field Cutting

The existing cutting contract will be renewed.

Additional work requested by sports clubs will be put out to tender.

Communications

A progress report was given on the planned new website and new email addresses for councillors.

PARISH PLAN DROP-IN SESSION - DUCHY BARN - SATURDAY, 19TH JULY

Dedham's Parish Plan sets out a vision for the future of Dedham and outlines how that can be achieved. Our current Parish Plan was published in 2011 so is now in need of updating. The content of the Parish Plan is led by the community and the process of updating it will involve extensive public engagement to identify areas of concern and highlight what needs to be improved or conserved, to guide plans for future Parish Council projects.

To get the process of updating our Parish Plan underway, an initial drop-in session will be held from 10 am to 4 pm on Saturday, 19th July at the Duchy Barn. The purpose of this initial event is to start to gather information about local concerns and to sign up volunteers to help take the process forward.

This will just be the start of community engagement and there will be many other events and opportunities for participation in the Parish Plan process, but we would love to see you there.

We are particularly interested in your views on Dedham's strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats based on the following three questions:

- •What is special?
- What are the problems?
- What ideas do you have for improvements?

WHAT A YEAR!

The longest day is behind us and the garden is full of flower with a second flush of roses and lilies, daylilies and dahlias in bloom. We'll sow biennial seeds like foxgloves, honesty, forget-me-nots and wallflowers and – at the end of August – hardy annuals seeds from cornflowers and larkspur to pot marigolds or some poppies. They'll all make it through winter to flower next summer.

Much of the gardening, however, will be about keeping on top of the weeds, watering (yes, even with the British weather), feeding and deadheading to keep as much of the garden as productive as possible.

Dedham Horticultural Society meanwhile takes a bit of a breather and some space to look back on the year that's been and prepare for the programme to come.

This year, it was a pleasure to be able to learn more about designing and building a show garden at Chelsea Flower Show from the designer of the Panathlon Joy Garden, Penelope Walker, and landscaper Mark Richardson of Stewart Landscape Construction. They were able to take us through the year (or more) of planning the design and the landscaping a show garden requires, to the challenges of finding those perfect trees - and what to do when what you get doesn't match up to expectations or requirements! Penelope gave us insights into how to make a garden accessible for people with different abilities and how to plant for biodiversity.

Our annual Zoom meeting welcomed Ben Pope, Head Gardener for the private garden of Grayshott Manor in West Sussex. He shared his knowledge of how to create and manage beds and borders filled with herbaceous perennials and gave us plenty of tips to apply in our own gardens.

We learnt how Tim Smit developed the Eden Project, turning it from an old china clay pit into one of the most visited tourist attractions in the UK, and the plants and flowers from this country and around the world that can be found beneath its famous domes. We gained insight into how the attraction has evolved over the years to continue to appeal to people, and about Tim's other project; reclaiming the Lost Gardens of Heligan.

We welcomed the Ipswich Bonsai Society to give us an introduction to this fascinating hobby and artform. David brought some stunning miniature trees from his own collection and talked about how to turn a sapling found in the garden or hedge into your first bonsai tree. There were tips on care and plenty of questions from the audience.

Brenda Eyes gave two excellent talks on flower arranging, providing demonstrations and letting us put the finished results into our raffle. There were plenty of extra tickets sold on those occasions! She gave us tips for how we could create our own arrangements and the different styles to think about.



If you know someone who gives a great talk on gardening (even just a slight connection to gardening), we'd love to hear from you (contact details on our

Gardening Notes

website). We'd also love to know what might encourage you and others to come along. What kind of garden do you have? How do you use it? What kind of plants do you like?

If you have a general gardening question, why not email that to us too and we'll try to dig up an answer based on local knowledge (you never know, it might be something the internet and Al hasn't discovered yet). Maybe we'll address your question in a future article in the Parish Magazine.

Although our seven speaker evenings took up a significant part of our annual programme, we also held two open shows when anyone can exhibit their home-grown produce and plants for free. It's very much a village show and we'd encourage anyone who has a plant or two or a small veg patch to have a go. Maybe you've a knack for cookery or love taking photos - we have classes for that too. Every show welcomes some people who have never exhibited before and – although it can seem very formal – we're happy to offer tips to anyone unsure what to do or what makes a good entry.



Our annual plant sale outside Dedham Church in May proved once again that everyone likes a bargain and we sold more than half our stock while we were still setting up! We had plenty of lovely donations from members and other people who had spare plants and vegetable seedlings, for which we are very grateful. Soon after our final speaker evening in June, most of our members joined us for a relaxed morning of coffee, cake and plant talk in a local garden – the weather just about held after the rain and wind.

Our members also get first refusal of tickets to our annual Christmas Supper and Quiz, and our day trip by coach to a great garden attraction – both subsidised by the Society for its members. We went 'all out' for Christmas last year with lights, table decorations, music and silly hats for the committee, complementing the three-course curry supper and entertaining quiz – maybe we'll drag a tree in for 2025 (maybe).

We've just returned from Penshurst Place and Gardens in Kent, where our discounted package included a hugely interesting garden tour, lunch and access to the historic house as well as the gardens.

We work hard to put on such a varied programme of events that is enjoyed by so many Dedham residents and people from further afield. We'd welcome anyone new who'd like to come and learn a bit more about gardening and horticulture (even if you only have a balcony or the odd container or two). If you have a bit more time, we're also looking for new committee members to ensure we can keep the programme going.



Formed in 1993, Dedham Carpet Bowls Club has had to close owing to the lack of members. How different to the early days when the club had over 30

members, nearly all of them from the village. When the club closed in May there were only seven members from the village and of those, only four of the original members remained.

Originally the club just had one long mat, but subsequently it acquired two short (30 feet) mats which allowed the club to take part in Essex County Carpet Bowls Association (ECCBA) leagues and competitions.

The club also held internal competitions, one of the first was a club pairs competition which took place over the summer of 1994, 12 pairs took part.

Once the club was affiliated to ECCBA, members took part in various County wide competition such as Singles, Pairs and Triples events.

It enjoyed a very successful run in the Winter and Summer leagues, as the following selection of trophies shows. 2002 ECCBA Summer Singles Winners 2003-2004 Central Winter league Division 2 Winners 2007-2008 Central Winter league Division 2 Winners 2013 ECCBA Summer Singles Winners 2015 ECCBA Summer Singles Winners 2016 ECCBA Summer Singles Winners 2019 Essex Ferris Cup Winner 2022-23 Colchester Winter league Winners. (The last league win.)

It also ran a very successful Annual Competition from 2002 in memory of Peggy Brooks one of the founder members of the club. A Rose Bowl trophy for the competition winners was supplied by an anonymous donor.

The competition ran for 18 years until the 2019, originally at the Assembly rooms and then at Nayland village hall which was more suitable, as it had all the equipment to hand. The competitions raised in excess of £5,000 for local charities as well as funds for the club.

In 2020, Covid struck and had a major impact on Carpet Bowls generally and a number of local clubs didn't survive. Dedham managed to keep going but numbers dwindled until unfortunately it was no longer possible to carry on.

The sports club retains the mats and the bowls if there was any interest in restarting it at all.
